2 story typical residential unit, 3 bedrooms with basement. Built 1968 / 1969.

Notes: The home itself is currently undergoing heavy renovation; new wiring and HVAC are present upon baseline and consultation. The noise level in the neighborhood is high due to the close proximity of the homes as well as it being a short distance from a high traffic airport hub.

Note:

All recording equipment was loaded with both fresh batteries and recording media as is MPI investigation protocol, and voice checks were performed for recognition and recording quality. All media transferred to digital file for review upon completion of the investigation.

Equipment Placement - Video:

DVR Camera #1 – Main Floor (*Office Area*)

DVR Camera #2 – Main Floor (*Living Room*)

DVR Camera #3 – Main Floor (*Hallway*)

DVR Camera #4 – Basement (*Main Room*)

Equipment Placement - Audio:

Mobile Units – Each investigative team had at least one mobile recording unit on hand during each investigation rotation and area.

Note: All ‘mobile’ units were outfitted with external microphones to limit possible contamination of audio evidence.

Wireless – (Stationary) Basement (*Main Room*)

Note: Each DVR camera is equipped with audio, and acts as a stationary device for each camera position.

Case History – Consultation Notes

Consultation Date: January 31st 2008

MPI Representative: Chris Forsythe

Note: All permission and investigation request documentation was reviewed and signed by client at the date of consultation.

Upon meeting with the client we were able to map out the location of the supposed events that the homeowner had witnessed and sensed. The homeowner had also mentioned that notes were taken of the times and locations of the activity (these logs have been added to this report for supplemental data). According to the homeowner several other people had also witnessed these phenomena as well. At the time of the consultation no one is living at the home as it is undergoing renovation for habitat.

Client Notes: (Activity Witnessed & Noted By Client)

2-2-08 (19:12 PM EST.) – Radio was turned off, but started to make noise that increased in volume.

2-9-08 (12:15 PM EST.) – I heard what sounded like a “sigh” than a few seconds later I heard / felt a breath in my right ear. I had a strange “tingle” on my right thigh at the same moment.

2-23-08 (16:10 PM EST.) – I was working in the kitchen when I noticed I had a scratch on my left arm; it did not burn or itch, it just appeared about two inches above my wrist all red and welted.

2-24-08 (17:04 PM EST.) – I was in the kitchen working and two other people were in the house with me; these two persons were in the basement. I could hear them talking while I was facing the sink when all of a sudden I heard what sounded like a dog walking toward me from the living room area. When I turned to look, nothing was there this lasted only a few seconds.

2-24-08 (17:35 PM EST.) – We were all sitting in the living room talking about work we would like to do in the attic. I suggested taking wood up there and immediately after saying that it felt and sounded like something went into my right ear. I asked to have somebody look to see if it was a bug and they could not find anything. This lasted only a few seconds.

3-16-08 (15:10 PM EST.) – The water pressure was getting really low only in the kitchen, so someone went down to check it out. As I was sitting in the kitchen I heard a drawn out “NO” and when the other person returned I asked them about it and they told me they didn’t say anything.

No other data to report at the time of the consultation. Further data will be gathered at the pre-investigation setup.

Evidence Review & Findings

Photographs (Digital / Film):

As is MPI protocol several hundred photographs were taken during the duration of the investigation period. Upon review of all submitted photographic material, no anomalous activity was captured on film at this location to report. Due to significant ongoing renovation dust particles were apparent in most of the photographs taken.

EVP / Audio (All):

Notes: Due to this locations close proximity to and airport and close neighbors several instances of “audio contamination” were present.

Camera #1 Audio (Stationary) – No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

Camera #2 Audio (Stationary) – No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

Camera #3 Audio (Stationary) – No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

Camera #4 Audio (Stationary) – No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

Mobile Units - No physical evidence was captured on these devices at the time of the investigation.

Wireless: No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

Video:

Note: All cameras were hard mounted to tripods and checked prior to the start of the investigation; all cord lines were taped and marked to eliminate false camera movement.

DVR Camera #1 - No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

DVR Camera #2 - No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

DVR Camera #3 - No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

DVR Camera #4 - No physical evidence was captured on this device at the time of the investigation.

Thermal:

Laser Contact Gauges (LCTG) and Ambient Gauges (ATG) as well as a data logger with external thermocouples were used for both baseline and notation throughout the investigation process. A cold spot was noticed in one area of the residence during rotation #1 Alpha (refer to investigator personal experiences section); this cold was not noted on the equipment present in that area.

EMF:

No significant fluctuations or high readings were recorded during both the baseline and investigation process.

Investigator Feeling / Experiences:

(Note: Personal experiences cannot in itself determine paranormal activity in a location, unless documented by video or audio equipment)

Final Analysis:

As is MPI protocol, all of the data collected was reviewed for any anomalous activity that may have been present. After a thorough examination of all of the data, we were unable to capture any paranormal activity in any form during our visit to this residence. It was noted at the time of the investigation that the activity claimed by the homeowner can be sporadic and unexpected at times; therefore, we will continue to leave this case open for further investigation and study and keep in contact with the client to keep up to date on any new or repeating activity that may be taking place.
